

# **Overview of Ohio's Youth Detention and Correctional Facilities**

### **Juvenile Detention Facilities (34)**

A juvenile detention facility is used, instead of an adult jail, "to detain alleged delinquent children until final disposition..., to confine children who are adjudicated delinquent children and placed in the facility..., and to confine children who are adjudicated juvenile traffic offenders and committed to the facility..." (ORC Sec.2152.41(A)).

## **Youth Community Correctional Facilities (11)**

A community correctional facility (CCF) serves as an alternative placement for adjudicated delinquent children and youth, instead of a state JCF, or as a step-down from a JCF before a youth returns to their community. A CCF is a "county or multi-county rehabilitation center for felony delinquents who have been committed to the Department of Youth Services and diverted from care and custody in an institution and placed in the rehabilitation center" (ORC 5139.01(A)(14)).

- Lucas County Youth Treatment: 32 beds, males and females.
- Juvenile Residential Center of Northwest Ohio (Wood): 42 beds, males only.
- North Central Ohio Rehabilitation Center (Marion): 20 beds, males only.
- Montgomery County Center for Adolescent Services: 35 CCF beds, males and females (and 15 beds for DYS girls).
- Butler County Juvenile Rehabilitation Center: 30 beds, males only.
- Miami Valley Juvenile Rehabilitation Center (Greene): 24 beds, males and females.
- Northern Ohio Juvenile Community Corrections Facility (Erie): 30 beds, males only.
- Multi-County Juvenile Attention System Community (Stark): 24 beds, males only.
- Oakview Juvenile Residential Center (Belmont): 16 beds, males only.
- Perry Multi-County Juvenile Facility: 20 beds, males only.
- Hocking Valley Community Residential Center (Athens): 24 beds, males only.

#### **ODYS State Juvenile Correctional Facility (3)**

A state juvenile correctional facility (JCF) is the most secure level of confinement for children and youth in the juvenile court system. Ohio's JCFs are "under the management and control of the Department of Youth Services" and provide for "the institutional care and custody of felony delinquents" (ORC 5139.01(A)(4)). Only boys are confined in ODYS JCFs; ODYS contracts with private residential facilities for the placement of girls adjudicated delinquent.
