It's not just about behavior.

| Pause | Notice your reaction to the person. |

| Think | What could the person be thinking and feeling? What does he/she want you to understand about his/her perspective? |
| Be Curious | Ask open-ended questions: Tell me, what's going on with you?What are your concerns here?How can we work together to improve this situation? |
| Listen | Try to understand the person's point of view. |
| Consider | What stage of change is this person in? |

| Connect | Meet the person where he/she is. |
| Explore Options | Exchange ideas about what to do next. |
| Be Open | Ask more open-ended questions: How do we move forward together? What steps can each of us take? |
| Recognize Success | Acknowledge that change is hard and give credit for small steps. |
