Faculty Biographical Sketch

G. Regina Nixon is an instructor at the Mandel School of Applied Social Sciences. She received the B.A. from Case Western Reserve University and the Ph.D. in Sociology from Howard University. Dr. Nixon joined the MSASS faculty in 1988 and teaches research, theory, and macro skills courses. She has been an active member of the Committee on Students, Curriculum Committee and the Faculty Senate. Dr. Nixon is also former Co-Director of the Center on Poverty and Social Change. She has been the Director of Project Go since 2000.

Dr. Nixon has extensive experience in the design and management of community based evaluation projects. These projects have ranged from single site to multiple site designs. They have been funded by a variety of sources including federal agencies, local and national foundations, and social service organizations. Several issues have framed her research agenda:
