## DAVID L. HUSSEY, Ph.D.

Faculty Biographical Sketch

**David Hussey** is an Associate Professor at the Mandel School of Applied Social Sciences (MSASS) at Case Western Reserve University (CWRU). Dr. Hussey also serves as the Director of the Leadership Fellows Program, and the Associate Director for Research at the Begun Center for Violence Prevention Research and Education. Dr. Hussey is a licensed independent social worker -supervisor (LISW-S), and the Director of Research and Evaluation at Beech Brook, a children's mental health agency in Cleveland. From 1999 to 2012 Dr. Hussey was on faculty at Kent State University, first appointed in the Department of Justice Studies, and then serving as a founding faculty member in Kent State's College of Public Health.

Dr. Hussey's primary areas of research are in mental health, violence and victimization, and behavioral health interventions. Dr. Hussey is an accomplished clinician, researcher and teacher, with over thirty-five years of clinical experience in health, mental health, and child welfare settings. He has designed and directed a variety of therapy and treatment programs in residential, inpatient, outpatient, and community settings.

As a researcher (Principal or Co-principal investigator) Dr. Hussey has generated over ten million dollars in research funding, and maintains a strong focus on applied community based research, collaborating with multiple public and private health and human service entities. In 2009, the *International Criminal Justice Review* honored Dr. Hussey as a co-recipient of the Richard J. Terrill Award for "Paper of the Year" for his coauthored cross-national study of crime patterns in over thirty countries.
