The Certificate in Nonprofit Management (CNM) is a non-degree professional certification. This program serves to increase knowledge in critical areas of management. methodology and the operational environment of the nonprofit sector.



Jackie supervises all satellite programs, the clinical activities counseling staff, and serves as an instructor for staff who are the process of becoming certified chemical dependency counsel




