Faculty Workload Policy

Non-Tenure Track Faculty

Faculty members in the Mandel School have six workloads. The teaching load for non-tenure track faculty members in the Mandel School is 18 credits in the academic year.

Faculty members are expected to contribute their fair share in advising students regarding the academic program and in serving on school and university committees. In addition, faculty members are expected to contribute service in the broad community outside the university.

It is the policy of the Mandel School to relieve faculty members of teaching assignments when their research and/or service merit additional time to fulfill those responsibilities successfully. This policy is effected though the following practices with the expectation that each non-tenure track faculty member will teach at least 9 credits in the academic year.

- Active Scholarship: One course buyout (3 credits) with the publication of at least three peer-reviewed articles or chapters, and/or one book in the calendar year prior to the workload year. For example, publications in 2019 count towards a buyout in academic year 2020.
 Scholarship that is "in press" will not be counted.
- 2. External Funding: 15% of academic salary and fringe benefits per course.

3. Course release for Administrative work when the faculty member is in the non-tenure track.
