Advancing the Study of Complex Interventions: Developing a Program Theory of Change for a Hospital-Based Violence Intervention Program using Grounded Theory

I started this paper in SASS 623: Systematic review methodology and will submit it this fall.

Tuschman, P.J. (In preparation). Social pain in response to stigmatization: A warning signal in response to threatened power, status, and inclusion.

I originally completed this paper as a course assignment in SASS 644: Critical theories of social welfare and will submit it to a journal this year. I take an evolutionary perspective on social pain, which argues that social pain functions like physical pain (or a threat detection system) in which aversive feelings in response to rejection or alienation alert people to threats in their environment associated with isolation or devaluation. Historically, being isolated or devalued has presented threats to survival; this warning signal prompts people to reconnect with others or address threats to their power and status. I elaborate on prior concepts of perceived stigma by delineating

three social motivations that are threatened in response to stigmatization at the interpersonal and structural levels: Power, status, and social connection. Broadly, this work aims to understand why people feel stigmatized and ways to promote their overall well-being.

Tuschman, P.J. (In preparation). An evolutionary mismatch hypothesis of loneliness and perceived stigma: Threat detection and self-consciousness in prehistoric and modern environments.

This paper takes the above paper a next step further, in which I address a more specific question about cognition and social pain. When people feel lonely or stigmatized, why do they experience cognitive impairment, if social pain is supposed to function as an adaptive warning signal? In response to rejection or the loss of a loved one, the pain of loneliness or grief can be overwhelming and interfere with functioning. Similarly, when people feel stigmatized, they sometimes feel persistent and overwhelming self-consciousness. Evolutionary mismatch refers to a gene-environment interaction in which “old genes” misfire in “new environments.” Cultures evolve faster than genes, resulting in some genes having unwanted side effects in modern societies. Some evidence suggests that rejection or alienation more often resulted in death in small-scale societies, earlier in human evolution, in which isolated people found themselves completely alone and had to find their own food and shelter. Thus, a more intense social pain response may have been required to avoid isolation in earlier societies. However, today, we still experience this intense social pain, consisting of a “self-preservation mode,” in which we have a heightened stress response, hypervigilance for social threats, and self-consciousness. Therefore, I suggest that our biology that processes social pain is “outdated,” resulting in cognitive impairment and distress.

Tuschman, P.J. (In preparation). Origins of mental health stigma.

This paper aims to explain the motivations for stigmatizing mental illness and the origins and functions of mental health stigmatization. I suggest that mental health stigma evolved from a system of social norms that regulates behavior, facilitates cooperation, and punishes people who violate norms. This work broadly aims to inform ways to prevent the stigmatization of mental illness, beyond reducing negative attitudes toward people with mental illness. This approach generally involves promoting positive social relationships, resource access, and opportunities for people with mental illness to promote their overall well-being. This paper is intended for a mental health stigma audience, so I will try to make it less about evolution.

Tuschman, P.J. (In preparation). Social motivation and self-regulation: Power and social connection as competing motivations.

This paper elaborates on an existing argument in social psychology, which is that power (the capacity to control or influence the states of others) and social connection are core motivations and that pursuing one involves undermining or “letting go” of the other. That is, pursuing power can undermine relationships, in which being selfish, trying to gain the upper hand, or hurting others can lead social partners to withdraw. Conversely, initiating social relationships or resolving conflict may require being vulnerable and letting go of control (e.g., asking for a date, forgiving others). Thus, I suggest that power and social connection are competing motivations, in which people must balance meeting their needs and the needs of others, and that there are costs and benefits of selfishness and “otherishness.” Similar arguments have been made in the literature: Jennifer Crocker’s compassionate and self-image goals, Adam Grant’s *Give and Take*, Dacher Keltner’s *The Power Paradox*, and Ed Deci and Richard Ryan’s self-determination theory. I will apply this framework to understand the motivations for stigmatizing others and how people respond to stigmatization. In the future, I will pursue a more specific question within this framework about empathy and aggression to understand why people sometimes *enjoy* hurting or stigmatizing others (and feel a sense of control) or, in other situations, feel empathy, guilt, or shame (and may feel a desire to help or connect with someone).

Tuschman, P.J. (In preparation). Shared intentionality and power dynamics: The role of competition in individual and collective motivation.

This paper shifts the focus on motivation to the group level. Shared intentionality (i.e., having joint goals with others) plays a fundamental role in human cooperation and discrimination. This paper aims to explain how individual motivation reaches the group level via power dynamics. Theories of group dynamics often understate the role of power in constructing collective behavior and social norms. For example, evolutionary theories of morality imply that social norms, such as those that prevent cheating, are essentially “agreed upon,” and benefit everyone more or less equally. I suggest that power plays a fundamental role in shaping collective behavior and norms, and, especially, inequality. I will apply this framework to understanding the construction of structural stigma and why groups discriminate against other groups.

Tuschman, P.J. (In preparation). Multilevel selection: Self-regulation, group regulation, and culture coevolve.

This paper is intended for an evolution audience. Multilevel selection (MLS) is an evolutionary theory that aims to explain the evolution of group-level characteristics. MLS is controversial among evolution scholars, as some argue that natural selection only occurs at the level of genes or individuals. I believe that group-level characteristics evolve in a way that at least resembles natural selection at the individual level. I am interested in MLS because it may have implications for understanding collective behavior and discrimination. I address one aspect of the MLS controversy about whether individual-level and group-level characteristics can evolve synergistically. I suggest that self-regulation, group regulation, and culture coevolve, aiming to clarify the relation between individual and collective survival, and I argue that individual and group-level characteristics can evolve synergistically. This paper incorporates the above frameworks on self-regulation and group regulation/shared intentionality. Although MLS is relatively young in terms of application to real world issues, I suggest that it may have implications for understanding issues like systemic racism - why institutionalized discrimination is resistant to change and how it has reinvented itself over time.
