Dr. Wallace J. Gingerich

Dr. Gingerich is Professor of Social Work and Founding Director of the Office of Educational Assessment at the Mandel School of Applied Social Sciences, Case Western Reserve University, Cleveland, Ohio. He previously served as Associate Dean for Academic Affairs for eight years, and Interim Dean for two years. His teaching and research interests include ability-based curriculum and learning, clinical practice, practice evaluation, solution-focused therapy, and Internet applications in clinical practice. Dr. Gingerich co-chaired the Mandel School's Assessment Task Force in the early 90's, which eventually led to the development of the Ability-Based Learning Program. Dr. Gingerich has published widely and consults with organizations on outcomes based education, solution-focused brief therapy and information technology. His memberships include the National Association of Social Workers, the Council on Social Work Education, the American Association for Marriage and Family Therapy, the Society for Social Work and Research, and the International Society for Mental Health online.

Dr. Gingerich received his MSW and Ph. D from the George Warren Brown School of Social Work at Washington University in St. Louis, and was a post doctoral fellow in mental health intervention design at the University of Michigan. Prior to his university teaching, Dr. Gingerich was a psychiatric social worker in community mental health settings in California, and was Director of Research at the Brief Family Therapy Center in Milwaukee, Wisconsin.
