Faculty Biographical Sketch

Victor Groza is the Grace F. Brody Professor of Parent-Child Studies at the Mandel School of Applied Social Sciences, Case Western Reserve University, Cleveland, OH. He is a licensed independent social work supervisor (LISW-S) and has a doctorate in Sociology. His research in child welfare focuses on three areas: (1) an examination of the institutional care of children, ways to improve the care of children who must reside in institutions, and the negative impact on child development from early institutionalization; (2) family, children and service system issues in domestic, older-child adoption and international adoption; and, (3) child welfare workforce issues. Since 1991 he has been involved in various child welfare technical assistance, research or training projects in Romania, India, Ukraine, Belize, Kazakhstan, Norway, Guatemala & Ethiopia.
