Cleveland Catholic Charities, Migration and Refugee Services (MRS) is one of approximately 100 affiliates of the United States Catholic Conference of Bishops, which has a cooperative agreement with the United States to resettle refugees who have been legally admitted through the federal Refugee Admissions Program.

The mission is to increase the population of Greater Cleveland & strengthen the region by working with employers, colleges & universities & community organizations to attract & connect newcomers to the region's opportunities, resources & services, and promoting the region as a welcoming place for all.

### **The International Institute of Akron**

The International Institute of Akron helps refugees and immigrants achieve an empowered life with dignity, connection, and belonging. They offer educational, vocational, social, legal, translation, and integration services. They have volunteer opportunities and semester-longer internships. Please note this organization is located in Akron, about 50 minutes from campus.

## **Joseph House**

In collaboration with Catholic Charities Migration and Refugee Services, Joseph House provides refugees resettling in Cleveland with affordable housing and a welcoming community. Joseph House also operates a Clothing Bank Ministry to serve incoming refugees and local neighbors in the St. Clair-Superior community.

## **Re:Source Cleveland**

Re:Source Cleveland empowers refugees to become self-sufficient and contributing members of their new communities. Re:Source was formed to help refugees adjust to life in Northeast Ohio. Re:Source works to empower our area's growing newcomer population, particularly those here between three months and five years by providing opportunities to acquire the skills they need to succeed in their new communities.

## **Refugee Services Collaborative of Greater Cleveland**

JRSC is a group of Cleveland organizations that have joined together to better serve the rising numbers of refugees resettling in Northeast Ohio. It includes the three Cuyahoga County refugee resettlement agencies and area school systems, healthcare providers, and community and faith-based organizations.

## **Salaam Cleveland**

Salaam Cleveland is a small nonprofit that primarily works with Syrian refugees and assists with resettling refugees through partnerships with Homeless Shelters, Health and Wellness programs, and community sites.

USCRI-Cleveland welcomes and holistically integrates New Americans as fully engaged citizens of Northeast Ohio. The organization offers a comprehensive refugee resettlement program, compassionate and affordable immigration legal assistance, and interpretation and translation services.
