

MEDICAID

Eligibility

To be eligible for Medicaid, you must:

- Be a United States citizen or meet Medicaid non-citizen requirements
- Be a resident of the state of Ohio
- Have or get a Social Security number
- Need health care/insurance assistance
- And must qualify as one of the following:
 - \circ Individual with low-income
 - Pregnant woman, infant, or child
 - Older adult
 - o Individual with a disability

Once approved, you will automatically be enrolled in either Fee for Service coverage or managed care. In Ohio, most individuals who have Medicaid must join a managed care plan to receive their health care. You can enroll in Buckeye Health Plan, CareSource, Molina Healthcare, Paramount Advantage, or UnitedHealthcare Community Plan.

How to Apply

All applications are to be processed within 30 days from the date the agency receives the application. Applications for Medicaid do not require interviews, but a worker may call to review questionable information on the application.

Verification Documentation

How can it be verified?
Birth certificate or electronic verification from
Social Security Administration
Birth certificate, US Passport, Certification of
Naturalization, or electronic verification from
Social Security Administration
Immigration documents and confirmation from
USCIS SAVE Website
Social Security Card or SS5, or electronic
verification from Social Security Administration
Medical provider written statement if multiple
babies expected
Paystubs, employer statement, award letters,
w2s, 1099s, etc. or electronic verification from
IRS or other electronic sources. Cooperation
with electronic verification process is a
condition of eligibility.

Programs for Children with Income Too High for Medicaid

Healthy Start Programs

Insured or uninsured children (up to age 19) in families with income up to 156% of the federal poverty level. Pregnant women in families with income up to 200% of the federal poverty level. Must be Ohio resident and US Citizen or qualified alien.

CHIP

Uninsured children in families with income up to 200% of the federal poverty level. Must be Ohio resident and US Citizen or qualified alien.

Healthy Families Program

Families with income up to 90% of the federal poverty level and a child younger than age 19. Must be Ohio resident and US Citizen or qualified alien.
