VETERINARY HELPLINE

Free general pet health helpline. Call 1.800.775.4519. Open 7 days a week from 10am to 7pm.

NEIGHBORHOOD PETS OUTREACH AND RESOURCE CENTER

From Tinkham Veale University Center: 17 min drive, 1hour 49minute walk, 46 min transit
Provides affordable pet supplies, a pet food pantry, low-cost flea prevention and dewormer, low-cost vaccine clinics, free ID tags and gently used collars/leashes, free spay/neuter for dogs and cats, medical assistance funding for emergency medical cases, euthanasia services for clients who are unable to afford the cost, and counseling, information, and resource referrals. Must live in Cleveland or East Cleveland and have total household income less than 150% of the federal poverty guidelines. Stop into the shop to sign-up and bring photo ID and proof of address. Pet Food Pantry and pet supplies available Tuesdays and Thursdays from 12pm to 4pm and Saturdays from 10am to 2pm. Vaccine clinics are by appointment only by calling 216.505.5853. Located at 3711 E 65th Street Cleveland OH 44105.

COMPANION PETS OF CLEVELAND

Strives to help families and their companion animals stay together during financially difficult times, times that could easily separate them because of the owners inability to provide food, supplies, and other basic needs. We provide pet food, cat litter, and other basic supplies through our pet food pantry. We may be able to subsidize vet costs as well up to \$75. ONE HEALTH ORGANIZATION

Program helps struggling pet parents with vet bills. Any eligible pet parent can submit an application for veterinary care for their cat or dog in need. The organization provides vouchers worth up to \$250 at local veterinary clinics. The voucher recipient calls one of our veterinary partners to make an appointment. After the appointment, the voucher recipient uses the voucher to pay the bill. You must live in Cuyahoga, Geauga, Lake, Lorain, Medina, Portage, or Summit County. ATHENA ANIMAL ADVOCACY GROUP AND HELPING PAWS PET FOOD PANTRY

Assistance for treating medical emergencies. Grants paid directly to veterinarians. Amount varies case by case ranging from \$50 to \$200. We also provide help for rescues, heartworm, and spay/neuter services.

CODY'S CLUB

Provides support for radiation treatment for pet. Submit a letter explaining why your pet needs radiation and your financial need. A letter from the treating veterinarian must accompany the application, outlining the animal's condition, cost of treatment, and prognosis. Send to 35 Nottingham Rd Columbus OH 43214. Donations will be made directly to the treating veterinary hospital, with a stipulation that it must be applied specifically to the radiation treatment.

JAKE BRADY MEMORIAL FUND

Provides funding for corrective, suitable, and life-saving medical treatments to companion animals of families in need. The goal is to provide quality care with focus on major occurrences (not for routine veterinarian visits) which may include emergency treatment, surgical procedures, testing, medications, vaccinations, x-rays, prevention therapy, and room and board. Fund recipients of companion animals include senior citizens or retirees on fixed income, low income families with documented annual incomes of less than \$18,000 per year, physically and/or mentally impaired, and unemployed and/or receiving government assistance.
