## **GOVERNMENT ASSISTANCE PROGRAMS**

### **SUPPLEMENTAL SECURITY INCOME (SSI)**

Federally funded program administered by the U.S. Social Security Administration. SSI provides financial help to disabled adults and children who have limited income and assets. To qualify, you must be at least age 65 or blind or disabled. The medical condition must prevent you from working and be expected to last at least one year or result in death. You also must have limited income and resources, be a citizen or national of the U.S., or an alien who meets certain applicable requirements. A person who receives SSI because of a disability can attend school and continue to receive SSI while a student. [Apply for SSI here.](#)



### **EDUCATION AND TRAINING VOUCHER**

Annual federal grant provided to states to fund youth who have aged out of the foster care system and who are enrolled in college, university, and vocational training programs. Students may receive up to \$5,000 a year based on their cost of attendance. They must enroll before their 21st birthday and may continue to receive support until age 23.
