# **GOVERNMENT ASSISTANCE PROGRAMS**

### SUPPLEMENTAL SECURITY INCOME (SSI) AND SOCIAL SECURITY DISABILITY (SSD)

SSI provides payments to individuals who have physical or mental disabilities that significantly impair overall functioning and who meet household income eligibility requirements. SSD pays benefits to disabled workers and their families. To be eligible, you must be disabled and must have earned a minimum number of credits from work covered under Social Security. The required number of credits varies depending on your age at the time you become disabled. To qualify as disabled, you must be unable to do any kind of substantial, gainful work due to physical or mental disability that is expected to last at least 12 months or result in death. It may take a while to get your benefits. It could take six months or longer. For information and to start the SSI application process, click here.



### **EDUCATION AND TRAINING VOUCHER**

The Ohio Education Training Voucher program gives up to \$5,000 a year in federal funding



for qualified school-related expenses for young people who aged out of foster care or who were adopted after age 16. To get the funding, young adults must enroll in a full-time post-



secondary education or training program by age 21, continue to be enrolled, and make satisfactory progress. Funding may be used for tuition, room and board, student loan repayment, books and supplies, transportation, and/or other related expenses.
