CWRU, through the Office of Equity, supports pregnant students, postdoctoral scholars and fellows, faculty, and staff so they can achieve academic and work success while pregnant, recovering from the birth of a child, caring for a newborn, and breastfeeding an infant. Title IX (which prohibits gender discrimination in education), Title VII (which prohibits gender discrimination in employment), and the Pregnancy Discrimination Act prohibit schools and employers from penalizing students and employees because they need time off from work or school, or reasonable adjustments, due to pregnancy, childbirth, or caring for an infant. The visit schedule, which consists of 10 group appointments between 90 minutes and 2 hours, provides the flexibility and time to explore health and wellness topics that might not be covered as extensively in a normal one on one prenatal visit. GOVERNMENT FINANCIAL RESOURCES

WOMEN, INFANT, AND CHILDREN (WIC) ASSISTANCE

WIC is the Special Supplemental Nutrition Program for Women, Infants, and Children. WIC provides free healthy foods, breastfeeding support, nutrition education and referrals to other services, to support you and your family. Call University WIC at 216.875.8805 to schedule an appointment. Located at 5805 Euclid Ave, Room 101, inside UH Rainbow Center for Women and Children. Pregnant and breastfeeding women; women who recently had a baby; infants birth through 12 months, and children age 1 to 5 years of age are eligible. You must also present at the clinic appointment and provide proof of identity, be a resident of the State of Ohio, be determined by health professionals to be at medical/nutritional risk and meet income guidelines (185% of the Federal Poverty Income Guidelines).

CASH ASSISTANCE - OHIO WORKS FIRST TANF

The Ohio Works First (OWF) program is time-limited cash assistance to eligible families through Ohio's Temporary Assistance to Needy Families program. The OWF cash benefit is limited to 36-months for families with minor children and pregnant women. OWF is available to families with at least one child under age 18, or age 19 if still in high school, and women who are at least six months pregnant. Once an application is submitted, a case worker from Cuyahoga County will be in touch to schedule your interviews and help guide you through the eligibility interview.

You may apply for Ohio Works First online by going to Ohio Benefits. Verification documentation includes social security card, Permanent Resident Card or proof of U.S. Citizenship, proof of income, most recent bank statements, proof of values of any stocks/bonds/certificates of deposits/life insurance policies/trust/annuities, proof of any child/dependent care costs, and proof of any child support paid for children not





living with you.
