**Who:** Students enrolled in an undergraduate degree program at CWRU who have unmet financial need. Preference will be given to undergraduate students who are typically underrepresented in study abroad. Students must have started an application for an approved study abroad program.

**What:** Scholarships ranging from \$500-\$1,500 to use toward study abroad program costs.

**When:** For Study Abroad programs occurring during one of these terms: Winter Break, Spring Break, Spring (May Abroad), Summer I, Fall, Spring, Summer, Academic Year, Calendar Year.

**Note:** If you are applying to the "think: global" scholarship for a short term study abroad program (ex: winter break, spring break, et. al.) apply to the academic year in which the short term program occurs.

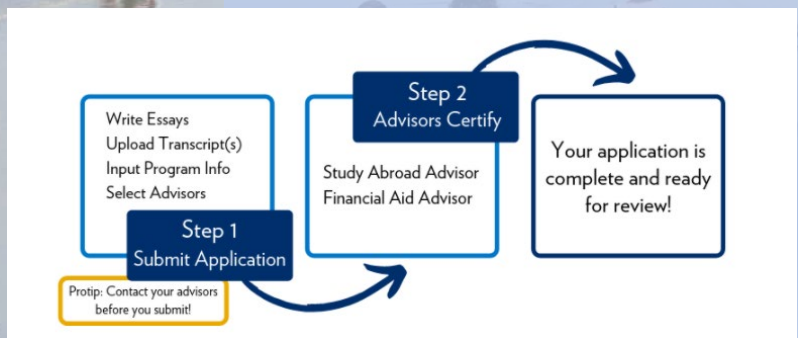

## 5 Questions to Ask Yourself: Follow-on Service Project Essay

- Does your FOSP increase awareness of the Gilman Scholarship and study abroad?
- Is your project feasible?
- Do you give a detailed plan for your project?
- Do you include your study abroad experience into your project?
- Do you have an intended audience? Who will you collaborate with to reach this community?



## 5 Questions to Ask Yourself: Statement of Purpose Essay

- Do you make a connection between your program and goals?
- Do you make a connection between your country and goals?
- Do you share how you will be academically successful on your program?
- Do you give examples of your experiences, skills, and knowledge that you will use to meet program challenges?
- Do you address how this abroad experience will impact your future?

## Study Abroad

Students who are recipients of **need-based or merit-based aid** and who plan to use this assistance for **study abroad** should provide official cost information for the chosen program of study to the Office of University Financial Aid. A Study Abroad Cost Sheet must be accompanied by some official documentation of the charges listed. Photocopies of the relevant pages from the foreign institution's bulletin are acceptable. **Download the cost sheet from the forms library.**

Students who are applying for need-based funds must submit the regular applications for financial aid along with the cost information. Log in to **My Financial Aid** or contact the Office of University Financial Aid if you have any questions about required forms.

University grants and scholarships are credited to your CWRU tuition account at the beginning of our regular semesters: late-August and mid-January. You must notify the Office of University Financial Aid if this schedule will not meet the requirements of your program.

Outside assistance is credited to the student's account upon receipt of the funds from the external source. Any excess funds are mailed to the student at his or her permanent home address or directly deposited. Student loan proceeds are generally disbursed at the same time, provided that the promissory note(s) have been signed and returned. Student employment is not available for study abroad.

# Private Loans

- Private student loans can be a great way to pay for study abroad expenses not covered by scholarships or federal loans; however, make sure you are completely clear on your repayment requirements. With lower interest rates and often no loan fees, private loans may be a good alternative to using high interest rate credits cards to pay for the cost of study abroad. Loans shouldn't be your first means of financing study abroad, but should be an option.

## Benefits

### Why Study Abroad?

Study abroad is an exciting, world-expanding education opportunity, but there are many more reasons why you should make it a part of your academic plan. Here we list a few\* of the benefits, but come talk to us in person in Tomlinson Hall, Room 143 to get more information!

### Career

- 97% of study abroad students found employment within 12 months of graduation, compared to 49% of the general college population
- 84% of study abroad alumni feel that studying abroad helped them build valuable job skills, such as language proficiency, cultural training, tolerance for ambiguity, adaptability and communication
- 70% of study abroad participants claim they are more satisfied with their jobs
- Study abroad alumni earn approximately 25% more than their peers who did not have a study abroad experience
- Study abroad provides an opportunity to interact with a diverse group of people and learn cross-cultural communication—a valued trait among employers



### Academic

- Studying abroad presents an opportunity to take classes not available at your home institution
- Study abroad positively impacts grades: Undergraduate students tend to see a rise in their GPA after a study abroad experience and are 19% more likely to graduate on time
- An overseas experience increases your probability of getting into your preferred graduate school: 90% of study abroad alumni report acceptance into their first or second choice of graduate school

### Personal

- 97% of study abroad alumni found that study abroad increased maturity
- 96% of alumni saw an increase in self-confidence after studying abroad
- 89% of study abroad alumni gained a greater tolerance for ambiguity

# AI and Essays

## Make it original

- Often essays will encounter AI detection
- Often not “prohibited” but....
- Can be excellent for construction/outlines
- Be honest!
- “do you feel like you understand who the student is”?
- *Glittering Generalities!*

- “The long-term impact of receiving this scholarship would significantly enhance my career prospects.”
  - *What are those career prospects? What career goals is the student trying to reach?*
- “This opportunity will broaden my perspectives and enhance my understanding of the subject.”
  - *Is it clear what subject they are referring to? Does “this opportunity” reference something specific, or is it vague?*





# HOW to study abroad

- Set up a meeting with an advisor
  - Go to “Connect with Us” on website or MyJourney
  - Drop In hours
- Search for programs:
  - Database to search terms in which to study abroad, majors offered and countries or regions
