

## CODE OF CONDUCT

### Violations:

- Possession of a weapon or use of a weapon against another person.
- Selling, attempting to sell, or giving controlled substances, illegal drugs, counterfeit drugs, intoxicating substances or alcohol. These infractions will be reported to the police.
- Purposely setting fire within the camp setting or tripping the alarm.
- Physically assaulting a staff member or fellow program participant.
- Gambling.
- Smoking or using tobacco at any time or place during camp hours.
- Possession, concealing, or using intoxicating substances such as alcohol or drugs.
- Intentionally or recklessly causing or threatening physical or emotional harm to another or behaving in such a manner as to present an imminent risk or such harm.
- Use of explosives.
- Damaging University property
- Throwing food items
- Theft.
- Gross insubordination. Failure to comply with directions or otherwise acting in defiance of camp authority after a specific warning in the presence of others.
- Intentionally or recklessly damaging camp or private property or behaving so as to present imminent risk of such damage.
- Engaging in sexual activity. No inappropriate touching between program participants.
- Using profane, vulgar, or other improper language or gestures.
- Bullying another NYSP participant or camp employee.
- Aiding or abetting any violation of this code.
- Insubordination, such as failing to comply with the directions of camp personnel or otherwise acting in defiance of camp authority.
- Failing to be at the assigned location. This includes but is not limited to switching groups without proper authority, roaming campus, and skipping classes.
- Cell phones will be allowed in camp **ONLY** at the parent's request, but the National Youth Sports Program will not be responsible for any cell phones and/or electronics that are lost or stolen.

**Noncompliance to the Code of Conduct can lead to dismissal from the National Youth Sports Program.**
