## **REQUEST FOR INFORMATION Re: Assistance Animal**

## **Assistance Animal Defined**

An assistance animal is an animal that provides emotional support that alleviates one or more identified symptoms or effects of a person's documented disability.

Unlike a service animals, an assistance animal does not perform ADA-defined "work" or "tasks" and thus is not generally permitted to accompany a person with a disability at all times. Therefore, although assistance animals may be considered for access to University housing, they are not permitted in other areas of the University, except as outlined in the Pet Policy in the CWRU Handbook.
