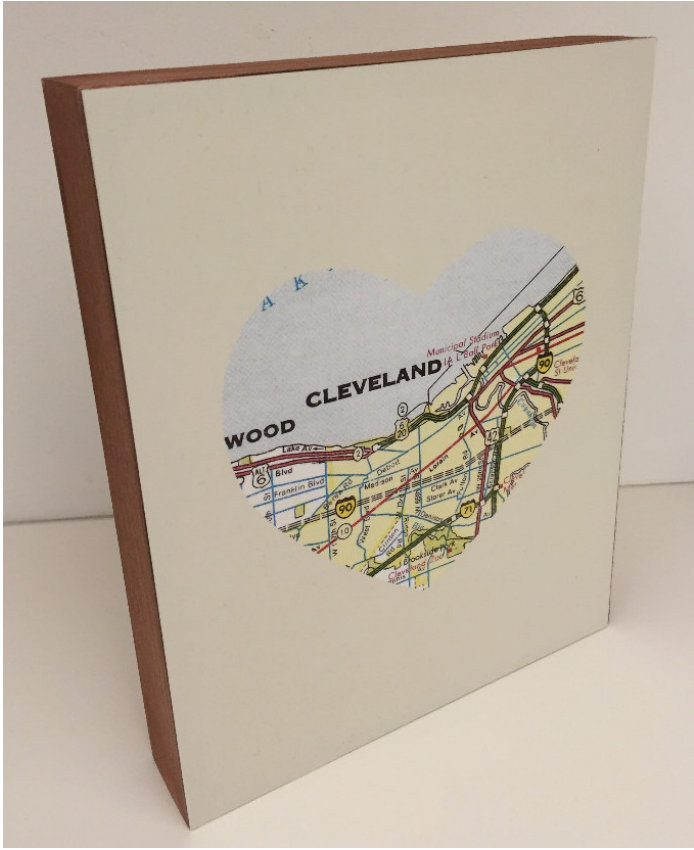

## Time to Eat In, China in the Tink

The [food court at the Tinkham Veale University Center](#) now has a plates and silverware option for those dining in. Previously, only to-go cartons and containers were available, which ultimately went to the landfill. The [Bon Appétit Management Company](#), CWRU's catering service, has proven to be a great partner in furthering campus sustainability efforts, from increasing local food purchases to composting pre-consumer food scraps in their kitchens. Jim O'Brien, Bon Appetit's Resident District Manager states, "I thought that [offering a china option] was the right thing to do in a new setting that reflects environmental and construction standards over and above the norm. Why shouldn't Bon Appetit participate in that vision by offering a convenience that more closely resembles a nicely prepared and presented meal/entrée that is not eaten out of a box?"

The Tink is a US Green Building Council Certified Gold building and so the china option is an additional green operations story that will help the CWRU community head towards zero waste.
