Plastic Bag Legislation in Cuyahoga County

Legislation has been introduced in County Council to reduce the use of plastic and paper carryout bags by retailers in Cuyahoga County. The legislation will require retailers over 7,000 square feet to charge a ten cent fee for each single use bag used per customer. The fee will be split between the retailers and the county's Environmental Remediation Fund. This Fund will help to clean up waterways including lakes and rivers as well as fund pollution prevention and education. Additionally, the fee will pay for free reusable bags to be given to Cuyahoga County residents at public locations. A final vote by the County Council will take place at the January 2018 meeting. Recycling Your Fridge for Cash

The First Energy Corporation will pick up and reward you for recycling your old refrigerator or freezer, helping you to upgrade to a more energy efficient model. You can also recycle a room air conditioner or dehumidifier when recycling your refrigerator. This program is for those with First Energy accounts only. A \$50 check will be mailed to you four to six weeks after pick up. Additionally, if purchase a new Energy STAR rated refrigerator, you can earn up to an additional \$75 rebate.
