

# INCREASE YOUR SCOOTER IQ!



## *Always wear a helmet*

Protect your investment!



## *Ride with traffic on the road*

Follow all signs, traffic lights, and signals



## *Slow down for pedestrians*

Pedestrians have the right of way. Dismount & walk scooters when sidewalks are congested



## *Scooter defensively*

Assume cars won't see you; use caution near parking garage exits



## *Don't wear headphones*

You need to listen for warnings



## *Announce yourself*

Say "on your left" when passing



## *Park responsibly*

Park at or next to bike racks on campus, off sidewalks & away from building entrances



## *Keep scooters out of buildings*

Scooters may not be ridden, charged or stored in any CWRU-owned buildings



## What You Need to Know



The City of Cleveland has permitted four companies to operate dockless electric scooters: **Bird, Lime, Spin, and VeoRide.**

- Each company offers an app users can download to use their scooters.
- Scooters are only permitted to operate between **7 a.m. and 7 p.m.** Scooters will not operate before or after those times - plan your trips accordingly!



Low cost helmets may be available to riders via the scooter company's app after your first ride. Helmets will also soon be available for purchase in Thwing Center at the Service Counter in the Atrium during normal business hours for \$12 (cash, Case Cash, or charge only).



Drivers must give bikes and scooters **3 feet** when passing - it's the law!
