What are you offering the community?

My vision for food justice helps communities like Mt. Pleasant who need economic development by using an urban farm and education campus to feed people's minds and stomachs.

PROBLEM

Why is this needed?

Citizens across class are very disconnected from the food process. They don't know how their food is made, they're used to going to a store. Convenience rules the mind of Clevelanders; people have the expectation that big corporations will make the food available for them in fast food, restaurants, and grocery stores.

We need to purchase the land that we are currently leasing from the Land Bank, and the other five contiguous lots around it so that it can become the foundation for the agricultural paradise in Mt.
