### Ohio HEALing Communities Study: Combating the Opioid Crisis



Case Western Reserve University received a \$65.9 million federal grant from the National Institutes of Health to launch Ohio's participation in the HEALing Communities Study (HCS). HCS is an initiative that will systematically plan, implement and evaluate data-driven approaches to integrate multi-pronged, evidence-based interventions within health care,

Mandel School of Applied Social Sciences have joined forces with researchers, practitioners, and representatives to combat the opioid crisis.

Swetland Center director, Dr. Darcy Freedman is leading Community Engagement efforts for Ohio and Landscape Analysis data report planning with the national team. Swetland Center staff members are coordinating these efforts with data collection and support, daily technical assistance to the Ohio team, and planning for additional phases of the grant that are scheduled to start at the beginning of 2020.
