Swetland Center Updated Mission, Vision and Values

In 2021, the Swetland Center conducted a Community Engagement and Racial Equity Assessment and held a Racial Equity retreat among staff, partners, and community leaders. From this work, action was taken to update our Mission, Vision, and Values.

Our **mission** is to study the complex interplay between environmental determinants and population health outcomes. The center places special emphasis on community-engaged approaches that address the role of structural racism in creating and sustaining environmental health inequities. We seek to translate these findings into policies, practices and relationships that promote community and population health equity. The strategic **vision** of the Swetland Center is to leverage diverse skills and experiences through transformative research, training and community engagement in order to achieve environmental health equity by:

- Advancing applied and community-engaged environmental health research.
- Integrating environmental health and community systems science into medical and graduate education.
- Engaging the community in research translation to inform changes in policy and practice.

Our **values** are to be:

- Innovative – We believe that honoring differences is foundational to cultivating a culture of innovation and changing the status quo.
- Collaborative – We believe in the strength of our collective voices, knowledge, and individual experiences as foundational strands woven together to create a tapestry of co-creation.
- Community Engaged – We believe that organizational transparency and elevation of community power and voice is essential to building trusting relationship between research staff and the broader community to achieve environmental health equity.
- Inclusive – We acknowledge and honor diverse traditions, learning styles and experiences of individuals and value the dignity of all

- Racial Justice – We partner with the community to build sovereignty and promote environmental justice by sharing power, igniting change, and dismantling racist structures. We seek to enact Research, Community Engagement, Training, and Education that heals historical scars and ongoing trauma of structural racism.
