



Conference Highlights

18th Annual Conference on the Science of Dissemination and Implementation, National Harbor, MD

Dr. Owusua Yamoah presented a poster in December 2025 focused on “*Reach and Uptake of a Technology Enabled Produce Prescription Program Among Safety Net Patients in Ohio – The Northeast Ohio Quality Improvement Hub*.” The poster highlighted results from a produce prescription program implemented by the Swetland Center with partners from the Northeast Ohio Quality Improvement Hub, which supported 400+ low-income patients from 13 primary care sites in northeast Ohio.

The Swetland Center partnered with The Ohio State University Extension to provide SNAP-Ed in Cuyahoga County from 2024-2025. The program is currently on pause due to a change in federal funding.

What is SNAP-Ed?

SNAP-Ed was a free, evidence based nutrition education program serving individuals eligible to receive SNAP benefits or other means-tested federal assistance programs throughout Ohio. The program provides education to help people make their SNAP dollars stretch, learn how to shop for and cook healthy meals, and lead physically active lifestyles. SNAP-Ed initiatives include nutrition education classes, social marketing campaigns, and efforts to improve policies, systems, and the environment of communities.
