Swetland Center Staff & Affiliates Publish in American Journal of Preventative Medicine

Swetland Center congratulates authors Tim Ciesielski ScD, MD, MPH, David Ngendahimana PhD, MS, Abigail Roche MS, RDN, Scott Williams PhD, and Darcy Freedman PhD, MPH on their article [Elevated Dietary Inflammation Among Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program Recipients Provides Targets for Precision Public Health Intervention](#) that was published in the American Journal of Preventative Medicine in May 2021. This paper found Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program recipients had elevated Dietary Inflammatory Index scores, implying higher diet-driven inflammation. This was due, in part, to low intake of 4 anti-inflammatory food components, which were higher yet still nutritionally insufficient among nonrecipients. Findings highlight

Indicators of readiness and capacity for implementation of healthy food retail interventions published in the Journal of Agriculture, Food Systems, and Community Development

Published in May 2021, this study from the Building Capacity for Obesity Prevention (BCOP) project discusses healthy food retail (HFR) interventions as a recommended strategy to improve the dietary behaviors of low-income residents with limited access to healthy food, but acknowledges that tools are needed to assess, tailor, and implement HFR plans to local contexts. The study identifies factors influencing HFR implementation and presents findings related to identifying, operationalizing, and prioritizing facilitators of and barriers to implementing HFR interventions within low-resource rural and urban contexts. Practitioners and community residents, recruited from nine counties in Ohio, participated in semi structured interviews and focus groups. Read the full article [here](#).


