
**An Epicenter of Change:
Earth Day in Cleveland 50 Years Later**

panelists to celebrate Earth Day as this year also marks the 50th anniversary of the Cuyahoga River burning. The virtual town hall addressed the multiple, intertwined crises faced today with the COVID-19 pandemic, societal inequities, and climate change. In particular, Dr. Freedman focused on a vision for Cleveland with regard to environmental and public health, as well as health equity. There was a reflection on historically recognized inequalities in access to greenspace, clean water, air, and fresh and healthy foods. Panelists urged for investigation and action upon these inequities given their rising presence among ethnic and minority populations that are experiencing disproportionate representation of COVID-19 hospitalizations. Additionally, lessons learned from research for food systems change were used as a call to action to address the “complex web structuring environmental injustice”.

The panel concluded with a call to action to share a story using **#EarthDayCLE**, which can be viewed on social media platforms.
