## Hot Off the Press

**Faculty Affiliate, Sadeer Al-Kindi, MD and Swetland Director, Darcy Freedman, PhD, MPH published article in the journal *Nutrition***

The article, "Food Insecurity and Atherosclerotic Cardiovascular Disease Risk in Adults with Diabetes," studied adults with diabetes who are at high risk of atherosclerotic cardiovascular disease (ASCVD). The research team theorized that food insecurity may be a major and underappreciated risk compounder in this population. Therefore, they analyzed the prevalence of food insecurity and its association with ASCVD in adults with diabetes.

## Swetland Spotlight

**Ravin Award winner, Anirudh Prabu, supports Data, Policy and Analytics at the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services**



This past summer, Anirudh Prabu interned at the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services in the Office of Minority Health. He worked in the Data, Policy, and Analytics Group and examined tobacco use disparities among patients enrolled in Medicare fee-for-service. He also looked at the role that environmental factors such as climate-related disasters play in exacerbating chronic diseases such as diabetes, hypertension, asthma, and depression. Prabu integrated this data into the existing work of the group and developed recommendations to mitigate the health disparities caused by climate change.
