Hot Off the Press

Faculty Affiliate Sadeer Al-Kindi publication on redlining featured in the Journal of the American College of Cardiology

"Historical Neighborhood Redlining and Contemporary Cardiometabolic Risk" was published in the July 2022 issue of the Journal of the American College of Cardiology.

To the researchers' knowledge, this is the first study examining the national relationships between redlining neighborhoods and cardiovascular diseases. The researchers' conclusion included that historical housing discriminatory practices are associated with modern-day cardiometabolic disease and risk factors.
