The Swetland Center is making a temporary move before we land in our new home in the MidTown Collaboration Center next spring.



SNAP-Ed Program Manager

We are hiring a full-time **Program Manager for CWRU's SNAP-Ed Program** that will serve Cuyahoga County. This person will work closely with the Ohio SNAP-Ed Program led by The Ohio State University. They will provide leadership in hiring, training, coaching, and supervising at least five SNAP-Ed community nutrition educators at Case Western Reserve University. Candidates must have at least 3-5 years of supervisory and related experience and a Master's degree or higher. Applications will be reviewed on a rolling basis with the goal of hiring by November 2024.

The ideal candidate will have:

- 1) A strong ability to work in community nutrition public health settings
- 2) Ample experience in supervising, teaching, program planning, and administration
- 3) Experience working with diverse and underrepresented populations

Request for Proposals for Produce Path Software Developer

In the next few weeks, we will be putting out a Request for Proposals for a web developer to enhance and maintain our Produce Path software over the next two years. **Produce Path** is a web and mobile application with two distinct interfaces: (1) Customer Portal that allows farmers market customers to get up-to-date information about markets near them and prepare for their visit and (2) Manager Portal that allows farmers market managers to manage their customer portal facing profile and also collect, manage, and evaluate information about their farmers markets and nutrition incentive programming. The manager portal is actively used by about 500 farmers markets across the United States.



The Swetland Center is seeking a full-stack software developer familiar with .NET API, AngularJS, Next.js, MSSQL databases, React/React Native, and AWS (the majority of services are hosted on AWS) to complete the migration of API from our legacy applications to the current website and support the software for two years.
