UCITE Course Innovation Grant (UCIG)

UCIGs support the design and implementation of innovative teaching and learning pedagogies for new and existing courses. Faculty receiving a UCIG take part in a learning community, meeting as a group a few times during the year, culminating in a poster presentation of their grant project at the end of the academic year.

6 faculty were awarded a UCIG in '24-'25.

Teaching Forward: An InspirED Celebration

Each spring, UCITE holds a teaching and learning colloquium where grant recipients present on their grant projects. In Spring 2025, UCITE expanded the colloquium to a full-day celebration of teaching and learning excellence at CWRU, including two "lightning talk" sessions by Nord Grant recipients, a Glennan Fellows panel, and a UCIG poster gallery.

AIIDE TLC

The principal goal of the AIIDE TLC (Advancing Intentional, Individualized Designs for Education through a Teaching and Learning Collaborative) is to create spaces for interdisciplinary discussion and practical activities that will expand faculty participants' application of teaching and learning practices grounded in the Universal Design for Learning (UDL) framework.

The Learning Fellows program provides teaching faculty members with a learning community of peer colleagues and common time for participants to explore the art and science of how people learn.



TOTEs

In the TOTEs (Teachers Observing Teachers Experiences) program, volunteer CWRU faculty hosts open their classrooms to peer observers in the spirit of sharing their passion for teaching and commitment to student learning.

AI Workshops



Spring Al Workshop Participation

In Spring 2025, UCITE launched a Generative Al workshop series focused on using GenAl for teaching and learning. Each workshop session focused on a different topic: Thinking with Al, Teaching with Al, and Learning with Al. The workshops, held in a hybrid format, taught participants how to prompt and use GenAl to assist in their classrooms. This was a wildly popular program, with 125 attendees over the 2 sets of 3-day, hour-long workshops.
