New Majors and Minors for Fall 2018

- New minor in African and African American Studies
- New concentration in Healthcare Management in the Business Management major
- New concentration in Materials Data Science in the Materials Science and Engineering major
- Engineering (Undesignated) is now General Engineering
- Eliminated the Classical Tradition concentration from the Classics major



New for Fall 2018

Case School of Engineering General Education Requirements:

At least 12 credit-hours comprised of three- or fourcredit hour courses outside of the areas of engineering, natural sciences, and mathematics.

Weatherhead School of Management Math 126 requirement:

MATH 126 or alternative chosen from DESN 210 (Python), ENGR 131 (Matlab), and EECS 132 (Java)



New for Fall 2017 College of Arts and Sciences General Education Requirements

- Breadth Requirements: One half or more of the breadth requirements courses must be taken at CWRU
- Global And Cultural Diversity
 - Course Credit through AP, IB A-levels or similar work in high schools may not meet this requirement
 - Transfer credit for college-level course work may be applied if approved by the appropriate department



Academic Policy Changes for Fall 2018

- WSOM students are now permitted to use Pass/No Pass for WSOM courses.
- Academic probation will no longer be an automatic action.
 Students will be able to appeal being placed on probation.
- Academic Integrity Policy Refresh



Academic Standing Changes from Fall 2017

- Students who withdraw after the 11 Friday of a semester may not enroll for the next two academic sessions
- Students placed on probation or continued on probation are required to review their course schedules with their navigator in Student Advancement before the end of the drop/add period
- Academic probation will be recorded on the unofficial/advising transcript but not on the official transcript


